It was a true pleasure to work with and mentor Lindsay as she is starting this journey into the teaching profession. She was always willing to communicate with the FDK team members and support staff to plan, prepare and adjust our daily plans when new inquiries were beginning with the students. Through "play" (which often doesn't require whole class lesson plans)Lindsay demonstrated the ability to pull small groups to interact, develop oral language skills of the children and take anecdotal notes on them. She quickly learned how to further develop plans to go along with students current interests and needs. Lindsay showed a keen interest in working with the Kindergarten students and teaching them new skills and methods in mathematics, especially in subitizing, tens frames and estimation. Lindsay also showed great enthusiasm in the literacy activities she created for the students. Lindsay was able to independently direct activities and play-based learning in the Kindergarten (Play-based) environment. She quickly recognized how to "see" learning as it was occurring through play. Lindsay can confidently assess and reflect on their learning through discussions and observations with the students. Assessment in FDK is often anecdotal and she was able to adjust her assessments to reflect this method.

Lindsay is encouraged to continue accessing courses, on-line forums and professional development courses to further extend her knowledge and experience in the teaching profession. She should continue to access the professional Kindergarten (or grade appropriate)on-line communities to help with reflection, ideas and personal growth.
